Pleasing to see we have a full house this year, with eight teams in three categories. Six Youth teams is a good turnout too.








Elaine Harris & Mary Anne Loveridge won the Restricted

Above is a hand from the last round of the Welcome Swiss. Nine pairs bid and made 3NT by South, while three went down.

Best is a spade lead but understandably most kicked off with the $ext{-}Q$. (There is a case for leading low instead but the queen lead is fine this time, **provided** partner unblocks the 10.)

If declarer ducks the opening lead, West can switch to a spade and wait for two more club tricks to go with partner's two diamond tricks.

Declarer will likely win the first trick to go after diamonds, having to lose wo tricks to East before they are set up. A club back then sees partner sitting over declarer's 9-6-5 with A-J-7 for one off.

If East neglected to unblock at trick one, 3NT would make becaue the defence would only be able to take two club tricks. The winners were +50 on the board for 7 IMPs in..






This week's Orange forecast. Some rain, not too cold.



At the Euros. Screens throughout, bidding on tablets but play with real cards.






Passed partner, favourable vulnerability.
