Meanwhile in Europe

We are down to the final eight in the European Championships - held in Germany - with the quarter finals to be held next week.

Well, that's the football.

Concurrently, the European Bridge Championships are being held in Denmark, with the usual Open, Women's and Senior Categories. (*Will we see a Mixed Interstate Teams at a future ANC? Asking for a friend*)

The 30 Open teams in Europe have played a complete Round Robin of 16 board matches. That's 464 boards over the 11 days.

Norway, Switzerland, Italy England, Israel, Belgium, Sweden and France have made it through to the next round, which for them is next year's Bermuda Bowl.

Shortly after the Euros, Australia will be represented in the World Youth (U26) Championships, to be held in Wroclaw Poland from 13 July. Lauren Travis – a member of the South Australian team that won the Open Interstate last year – will be there, as an npc.

I first attended an ANC way back in the mid-1980s when it was one of just a few annual national bridge events. In those days the main events (Interstate Teams and Butler Pairs) were of course the status events but the side events were also very popular. It is great to see that, here in Orange, we are seeing the side events return to these historic levels of popularity.

One aspect of my role at the ABF is to grow the popularity of bridge in Australia so I am very grateful to see you all embracing the opportunity that this year's ANC is offering.

On the same topic, I would like to highlight a couple of other things. Firstly, we recently ran a series of online beginners for under-25 year olds. We had over 100 enrolments and we did not charge them for the first four lessons. The attendees will now either progress with the online lesson program or join their local youth bridge group or both. 

A winter's day in Orange






From last year's ANC in Perth

South Australia nearly managed the **quadfecta**, winning the Open, Women's and Seniors plus runners up in the Youth!

Phil Markey from their winning Open team wrote an article for *Australian Bridge*: Here are a few hands:



West's pass was alerted because it showed values, since 0-7 counts would either transfer or wriggle via Stayman. Undeterred, North tried 2♣ Aspro which got them to 2♥, whereupon West has happy to pass East's takeout double for +800.



Most South's led a pedestrian diamond against 3NT for -600 but Nic Croft led ♥A-T for +100.


One North-South pair went for -2300 in 5 \$x, which we all know is the postcode for Newcastle. This fortnight, there should be a prize for anyone who goes five down in a redoubled vulnerable contract.



(OK, or six down redoubled, not vulnerable)

Here's a hand from the 2005 ANC at the Masonic Centre in Sydney:





3♣ was systemically a mini-splinter – four hearts and club singleton – which Steven forgot.

When Neville jumped straight to game in the known fit, Bock remembered. He tried $5 \clubsuit$, taken as a cue bid, hence $5 \bigstar$, looking for $7 \heartsuit$.

When 6♣ appeared, Neville worked out to give grudging preference to 6♦. When the ♦Q fell doubleton, that was 10 IMPs in.

Without screens, Bock would have seen partner alert his 3♣. Then he would have an awkward legal issue over 4♥. Over his strong jump shift, that sounds like ♥KQJxxxx and out. The *Unauthorised Information* from the alert would make that less likely.

ANC Facts and Figures

Paul Lavings. Figtree. NSW

A match between NSW and Victoria in 1933 created such interest that in 1934 the first ANC was played in Melbourne in both Open and Women's. Victoria won the first six Open contest and three of the first five Women's.

There was a 7-year break for WW2 and in 1946 with the great Victor Champion at the helm Victoria won again. In 1948 Tim Seres played and NSW dominated until Tim played his last ANC in Darwin in 1995.

In 2020 there was no ANC due to Covid and in 2021 an official ANC was played online.
