What's New This Year?

This year's Summer Festival of Bridge offers events to suit every skill level, from Rookies (U20 MPs) to our most experienced national competitors. A highlight of the program is our series of All-Rounder events, designed especially for Rookie (U20 MP), Novice (U100 MP), Restricted (U300 MP) and U750 MP players. Each All-Rounder follows the same format:

Day 1: Matchpoint Pairs

Day 2: IMP Swiss Pairs

Day 3: Swiss Teams

Daily Schedule

9am – 9.30am: Optional celebrity speaker session

10am – 5pm: Competitive play

5pm – 6pm: Optional practice session with hands linked to the morning talk

In this practical, hands-on session, Damon puts you in the hot seat and presents real situations where you choose your actions. Compare your decisions with others at the table and see whether you would make the same choices as Damon – and why.

A fresh new approach to When to Compete, and When to Defend. Which contracts should you aim to PLAY and when should you push the opponents out of their contract. Discussion about which cards are better for playing and better for defending.

The opening lead is the defence's first strike and often sets the course of the entire hand. This hands-on session puts cards in your hands, exploring how a well-chosen opening lead can build tricks, apply pressure, and put declarer on the back foot. Discussion will include choosing the right suit, leading with purpose, and using the auction to make that crucial first move count.


Public Transport

Venue Maps




Within the Canberra Rex Hotel, most games will be played in the Great Room (straight ahead and to the left as you enter the building) or the Ballroom (to the right as you enter the building).

Female toilets are located in the hallway leading towards the Ballroom and at the rear of the Great Room. Male toilets are located in the hallway leading to the Ballroom.

The bars and restaurants are a quick lift ride to levels 5 and 6. Be sure to head there after you play to discuss the day's hands and enjoy the view.

To the north, just across Ipima Street, is the Canberra Common which will host the finals series of the National Women's Teams and National Seniors' Teams, as well as the U300 MP and U750 MP All-Rounders.

Using Bidding Boxes, System Cards + Bridgemates

All ABF events require each partnership to have two identical system cards on the table for the opponents. Learn how to locate the convention card editor and fill in your system card [here](#).

For those who are new to Teams bridge, [this video](#) explains how to score up with your teammates and calculate your final VP score. Don't worry though, scoring up is not a mandatory process – the scoring team will automatically compute your score too.

If you are unfamiliar with using Bridgemates or bidding boxes, you are welcome to attend a session explaining the use of both tools on Wednesday 14th January at approximately 9:30am, after the celebrity speaker talk. There you can see a demonstration and ask any questions before you start play for the day.

Need Help?

Directors are in red shirts – please consult them about bridge-related matters. Caddies are in black shirts and are there if you run out of boards to play. For venue-related matters and lost property, please speak to the Rex staff.

The ABF is committed to ensuring that all players compete in a pleasant and respectful environment. To assist in this, we appoint recorders to facilitate the smooth running of bridge events. The role of recorders is to receive information (either verbal or written) from individual players as to concerns which may arise from events at the table, be available for consultation prior to commencement of play (10 minutes) and at the end of play (20 minutes), and consider the issue/s raised and take appropriate action. If you require a recorder, please speak with one of the directors who will assist you.

The Australian Bridge Federation was deeply saddened to learn of the death of Marika Pogany, who was tragically killed in the recent Bondi Beach attack.

Marika was a long-time and much-loved member of the Australian bridge community. A talented player who had been involved in the game from a young age, she was a regular presence at clubs and bridge competitions over many years. She was widely admired not only for her ability at the table, but for her warmth, generosity of spirit and the genuine care she showed to those around her.

Marika was a treasured friend to many, always bringing positivity, kindness and a wonderful sense of energy wherever she played. She was also a devoted mother and grandmother, and our thoughts are especially with her family and loved ones at this unimaginably difficult time.



Marika's loss will be felt deeply across the bridge community. She will be remembered with great affection and respect by all who had the privilege of knowing her.

Please Be Considerate

- ♥ Value your partner/s
- ♥ Be polite to other competitors and tournament officials
- ♥ Greet your opponents as they arrive at the table
- ♥ Introduce yourself to people you don't know
- ♥ Be on time
- ♥ Thank your opponents at the end of the round/match
- ♥ Explain your system clearly and simply, if asked
- ♥ Acknowledge good play by your opponents
- ♥ Don't discuss hands until the break
- ♥ Be understanding of newer players
- ♥ Respect our directors
- ♥ Report poor behaviour to the Recorder

Systems + System Cards

Each pair is required to have two current ABF approved, identical system cards on the table for the opposing pair before the start of each round.

GREEN and **BLUE** systems are permitted without restriction.

RED systems and **BROWN STICKER** conventions are permitted in all events except for Novice All-Rounder, Rookie All-Rounder, Under 300/100 Swiss Pairs and Restricted All-Rounder. In addition, in these events, the CTD may also further restrict a pair from playing any method which the director judges may not be readily understood by a significant proportion of players in the field.

Eligible pairs may claim Protected Pair status in the Chris Diment Matchpoint Swiss Pairs, Fixed Income Solution One Day Swiss Pairs, Under 750/500 Swiss Pairs and Intermediate All-Rounder.


Provided the required system submission (detailed below) has been complied with, **YELLOW** systems will be allowed in the South West Pacific Teams from Round 2 onwards. They may not be played against a contestant with a current position in the lower two-thirds of the field (decimals rounded up). **YELLOW** systems may be played in all matches of the National Open Teams.

Pairs intending to play a **YELLOW** system must provide the Tournament Organiser with an adequately completed ABF Standard system card and a bona fide defence before 7 January 2026.

Matchpoint Pairs Tips

For those who are playing the Chris Diment Matchpoint Swiss Pairs, National Rookie Matchpoint Pairs or National Novice Matchpoint Pairs first up, or are entered in the or National U750 MP Matchpoint Pairs or National Restricted Matchpoint Pairs later on, here are some tips to maximise your success at matchpoint scoring:

- ♠ Look for overtricks
- ♠ Bid to the highest scoring game – think about 3NT (even ahead of 4-Major)
- ♠ If you have received a favourable lead, then play safely. You are already ahead!
- ♠ If you have received an unfavourable lead, then take more risks to catch up to the rest of the field
- ♠ If you are in a normal contract (ie you will get an average score) then you should take risks for overtricks
- ♠ If you are in a great contract that others will not reach, then play safely for your contract
- ♠ If you are in a hopeless contract but can see that the opponents can make a contract their way, try to minimise your damage to a score that is less than what they can make
- ♠ Don't push for close games or slams (it is all about getting plus scores)
- ♠ Overcall often – but in and out early
- ♠ Be aggressive competing – try to push the opponents around if they are in a part-score and have found a fit – 'steal but don't get stolen from'
- ♠ Double aggressively (+200 is often a top and -200 a bottom) – if they are stealing the hand/contract from you, you need compensation
- ♠ Try to interfere over the opponents' 1NT contracts, because it's a tough contract to defend


